- Conduct geospatial analysis using GIS tools to develop and implement geofencing strategies.
- Ensure compliance with EUDR through accurate data analysis and reporting.
- Develop dashboards and visualizations data.

Scope of Work

- Perform geospatial analysis using tools such as ArcGIS, QGIS, and others.
- Handle and analyze data in various formats including JSON, GeoJSON, KML, and shapefiles.
- Create and maintain interactive dashboards using tools like Power BI and Tableau.
- Perform advanced data manipulation and visualization using Excel and related tools.
- Collaborate with cross-functional teams to ensure accurate and timely reporting for EUDR compliance.
